<b>AB 97</b>	Mendoza (D-56)	Author	<b>Food: trans fat</b> Prohibits storing, distributing, serving, or using any food, oil, shortening, or margarine containing specified trans fat in the preparation of specified foods within a food facility.	Chaptered: Chapter 2007, Statutes of 2008	Support
<b>AB 433</b>	Beall (D-24)	CFPA	<b>Food Stamp Program: categorical Eligibility</b> This bill would propose the development of a new name for the Food Stamp Program and would require the Department of Social Services to establish a categorical eligibility program for recipients of Medi-Cal benefits when recipients receive or are eligible to receive benefits funded under the federal TANF block grant. <b>AB 2168</b>	Jones (D-9)		<b>Farm Stands: direct marketing: retail food</b> Authorizes the adoption of regulations to encourage direct sale by farmers to the public, and provides that the "public" includes both individuals and entity members of the public buying for resale. <b>AB 2844</b>	Laird (D-27)	CFPA	<b>Public social services: CalWORKs and the Food Stamp Program: redetermination and recertification</b> Requires the state to move to a 6 month reporting system for food stamps and CalWORKS. <b>SB 168</b>	Denham (R-12)	National Federation of the Blind in CA	<b>Physical education for the blind and visually impaired</b> This bill would form an advisory task force to develop physical education guidelines to promote physical fitness by pupils who are functionally blind or visually impaired. <b>SB 602</b>	Torlakson (D-7)	Author	<b>Physical Education</b> Requires the Department of Education to ensure that the Categorical Program Monitoring process indicates the extent to which each school in a participating school district performs, including in the provision of the state required minimum minutes of physical education instruction. <b>AB 1966</b>	Garcia (R-80)	CFPA	<b>Pupil Nutrition: school meals</b> Requires each school site meeting qualifications for the federal severe need reimbursement to offer a nutritional breakfast that qualifies for federal reimbursement, beginning with the 2009-10 school year. This bill would only become operative if funding is available in the 2008 Budget Act.	Held in Assembly Appropriations	Support
<b>AB 2300</b>	Laird (D-27)	CFPA	<b>School lunch and breakfast programs: direct certification</b> Give the California Department of Education the authority to use MediCAL data to verify school meal eligibility. Additionally, give CDE authority to test usage of this data for enrollment as well. Require CDE to seek any available federal funds for this purpose.	Passed Senate Appropriations Senate Floor	Support
<b>AB 2704</b>	Leno (D-13)	CFPA	<b>Pupil Nutrition: availability of tap water</b> Prohibits the governing board of a school district from entering into or renewing a contract that discourages or prevents schools from providing free tap water and requires that each school district allow for the provision of free tap water in school food service areas. <b>AB 2463</b>	Davis (D-48)		<b>Hypertension and diabetes</b> Declares intent of the legislature to enact legislation to address the epidemic of hypertension and diabetes among low income persons and persons of color.	Held in Senate Appropriations	Watch
<b>AB 2474</b>	Galgiani (D-17)	CA- WIC	<b>Obesity prevention</b> Requires the Department of Public Health to establish a program to implement the recommendations for improvement identified in the comprehensive strategic plan (requires of the DHS in 2005), which would establish a systematic approach to tracking health impacts of obesity and evaluating prevention programs. <b>AB 2902</b>	Swanson (D-16)		<b>Public Health Outreach: community health care workers</b> Encourages the use of community based health care workers to provide better health outcomes for underserved communities through the various public health programs, and makes conforming changes in specified public health programs to include their use. The revenues collected from the additional tax would be deposited in the Tobacco Excise Tax Account and would be allocated, upon appropriation by the Legislature, for health-related purposes.
